


First 4th of July in Westport

July 4th was first celebrated Westport in 1858. Col. McGee offered the grove in the McGee Addition for the festivities. Over 2500 people attended—sons, daughters, wives, husbands, aunts, uncles, cousins, grandparents, friends, and neighbors. The celebration commenced at 10 o'clock in the morning, included a community pot-luck barbeque dinner and ended with a ball in the evening. Col. McGee bought a buffalo for the barbecue. The ill-fated buffalo escaped its pen a few days before the celebration. Excited neighbors gave chase, and luckily for the good of the celebration, the buffalo was captured after a chase of more than a mile.

Sweet Pickled Peaches

It is summertime and that means lots of sunshine, warmer temperatures, and the perfect time to go peach-picking. Long considered a popular and delicious fruit, the peach has been around since the 10th century. Originating in China, the peach was brought to America in the 17th century. Peach season is at its peak in July and August, so grab some baskets and head to the orchard.

Eight pounds of peaches	Two ounces of stick cinnamon
Four pounds of sugar	Two ounces of cloves
One quart of vinegar	

In a large pot, boil the sugar and vinegar with the cinnamon for five minutes, then add in the peaches, a few at a time, with one or two cloves with each peach. Simmer until peaches are done enough to be easily pricked with a fork. Take the “done” peaches out of the pot and repeat with peaches and cloves until all peaches have been cooked. Divide peaches evenly into glass jars.

Boil the remaining liquid until it is reduced to a syrup. Pour syrup over the peaches. Seal the jars while hot.

Repeat with additional peaches.

Wagon Wheel Hub Nut Wrench

This tool served as a hub nut wrench and a reach pin for wagon wheels. The hand-forged, cast iron wrench tightened or loosened the axle nuts. Measuring 10 ¼ inches in length, this tool is part of the 1855 Harris-Kearney House collection.

The salve:



